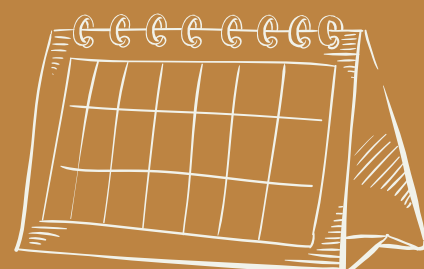


6 RESOURCES FOR COLLEGE ADMISSIONS AMID THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY

The College Board is working on ways for students to take AP tests at home, and is also developing free remote learning tools. Check the [College Board website](#) for details.



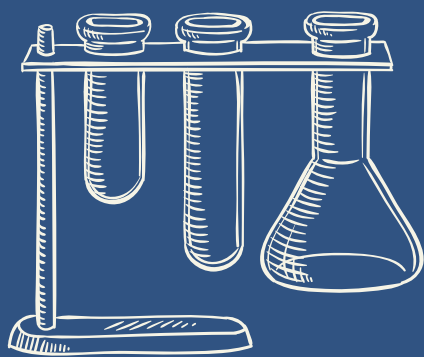
CONSIDER SEEKING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IF NECESSARY
