

## Moderate Independent Candidate & Ballot Access in 8 Battleground States HarrisX/No Labels Poll

*This survey was conducted online and by telephone by HarrisX in Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin from July 28 - August 3, 2023 among between 1,142 and 1,213 registered voters per state. The sampling margin of error of this survey is within each state is between plus or minus 2.8 and 2.9 percentage points depending on the state's sample. Results were weighted by gender, age, race/ethnicity, income, education, and political party where necessary within each state to align them with their actual proportions in the population.*
